Proposed Synthetic Turf Bowling Green at Sean Walsh Park, Tallaght, Dublin 24

Appropriate Assessment (AA) Screening Determination

Pursuant to the requirements of the above, South Dublin County Council is proposing to develop a new synthetic turf bowling green at Sean Walsh Park, Tallaght, Dublin 24.

It is intended to place the plans and particulars for the development of the synthetic bowling green on public display in accordance with the requirements of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) and Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 as amended - Part 8.

Having regard to Article 6(3) of the Habitats Directive, the guidance contained in the Department of Housing Planning Community and Local Government's "Appropriate Assessment of Plans and Projects in Ireland Guidance for Planning Authorities" (2010) Screening of the development for Appropriate Assessment was carried out from July 2025 to December 2025 by Fehily Timoney and Company, Unit 3/4, Northwood House, Northwood Crescent, Northwood, Dublin, D09 X899, Ireland.

The subsequent AA Screening Report concludes the following:

Following initial screening of the proposed project in Sean Walsh Park, and based upon best scientific judgement, it is concluded that there *are no likely significant effects on the qualifying interests, special conservation interest or the conservation objectives of any designated European site* including:

- Wicklow Mountains SPA
- South Dublin Bay and River Tolka Estuary SPA
- Poulaphouca Reservoir SPA

Following an examination, analysis and evaluation of the relevant information and potential for significant effects on the conservation objectives of Natura 2000 sites, and application of the Precautionary Principle, the Report determines, on the basis of objective information that the proposed development; either alone or in-combination with other plans and projects, will not result in likely significant effects on any European site in view of their conservation objectives. A Stage 2 Appropriate Assessment is therefore not required.

For the reasons outlined above it is considered that the proposal for a synthetic turf bowling green at Sean Walsh Park will not present a risk to any Natura 2000 sites. As such this screening exercise concludes that an Appropriate Assessment is not required for this project.
