Installation of a heat pump system at Clondalkin Civic Centre, Ninth Lock Rd, Clondalkin, Dublin 22, D22 E9X5.
- Project EIA Screening Determination.

Pursuant to the requirements of the above, South Dublin County Council is proposing to undertake the following works:

- Installation of a heat pump system, comprising of 2 No. 37.5kW Air Source Heat Pumps, in the car park area of the building, with associated site works.
- The heat pump system will be installed on a concrete base and surrounded by a 2.4m high mesh fence, with one access gate. This compound will be 5.24m by 4.95m.
- The heat pumps will be housed in an acoustic enclosure that is 2m in width, 3.04m in length and 3.225m in height.

It is intended to place the plans and particulars for the development on public display in accordance with the requirements of the Planning and Development Act (as amended) and the Planning and Development Regulations (as amended) – Part 8.

Having regard to EIA Directive 2011/92/EU, as amended by Directive 2014/52/EU (the EIA Directive), and the guidance contained in the Department of Housing Planning Community and Local Government's "Impact Assessment Guidance for Consent Authorities regarding Sub-Threshold Development" (2003); screening of the development for Environmental Impact was carried out in June 2026 by SDCC and Fehily Timoney, Unit 3 / 4, Northwood House, Northwood Crescent, Northwood Dublin, D09,X899.

The Screening was carried out in Accordance with the EIA Directive and to Annex I, II, and III of that Directive, which sets out the requirements for mandatory and sub threshold EIA. The proposed development does not individually or cumulatively fall into a class of development set out in Schedule 5, Part 1 and 2 of the Regulations and, therefore, does not require a Mandatory EIA. Sub-threshold EIA Screening to determine whether the proposed development would be likely to have significant effects on the environment, having regard to the criteria set out in Schedule 7 and 7A of the Regulations, was carried out.

Based on the information contained in the EIA screening report and having regard to the nature, scale, location and site characteristics of the proposed development and the characteristics of potential impacts, it is determined that the proposal for

the Installation of a heat pump system at Clondalkin Civic Centre, Ninth Lock Rd, Clondalkin, with associated site works will not present a risk to the environment, either alone, or in combination with the other plans or projects. As such, an Environmental Impact Assessment is not required for this project.
