Proposed Killinarden Park Upgrade and Greenway – Killinarden & Whitestown, Tallaght, Dublin 24

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Screening Determination

Pursuant to the requirements of the above, South Dublin County Council is proposing to carry out a park upgrade at Killinarden Park and a Greenway with a landscaped pedestrian/cycle route within Killinarden Park and between Killinarden Park and Sean Walsh Park at Killinarden and Whitestown, Tallaght, Dublin 24.

It is intended to place the plans and particulars for the proposed development on public display in accordance with the requirements of the Part XI of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) and Part 8 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended).

Having regard to (inter alia) EIA Directive 2011/92/EU as amended by Directive 2014/52/EU (the EIA Directive, screening of the development for EIA was carried out in April 2021 by JBA Consulting, Block 660, Unit 8, Greenogue Business Plaza, Greenogue Business Park, Rathcoole, Dublin.

The Screening has been carried out to determine whether the Project is a class set out in Annex I or II of the EIA Directive (transposed into Schedule 5 (Part 1 and 2) of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001, as amended) and, if the project is not subject to a mandatory EIA, the likelihood of having significant effects on the environment under the criteria included in Annex III of the EIA Directive (transposed into Irish Law in Schedule 7 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001, as amended) in order determine whether a sub-threshold development should be subject to EIA.


The EIA Screening Report has identified that EIA is not mandatory and, having been assessed in accordance with the criteria for sub-threshold development, the proposed development is expected to be low in environmental impact. Therefore, there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment arising from the proposed development and EIA is not required.
