

completed by considering all aspects of the proposed project that could result in the emission of potentially polluting material to the River Liffey. This examination found that the project and the associated works at the Lucan Demesne, Promenade, Village green and Main Street will pose a negligible risk to the water quality of the River Griffeen and the River Liffey locally in the vicinity of the project site works or downstream along the river.

Accordingly, the competent authority is enabled to determine that it can be excluded, on the basis of objective information, that the project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects, will have a significant effect on any European Site.

For the reasons outlined above it is concluded that the proposed developments are not foreseen to give rise to any significant adverse effects on any designated European sites, alone or in combination with other plans or projects. This evaluation is made in view of the conservation objectives of the habitats or species for which these sites have been designated. Consequently, a Stage Two AA is not required.
