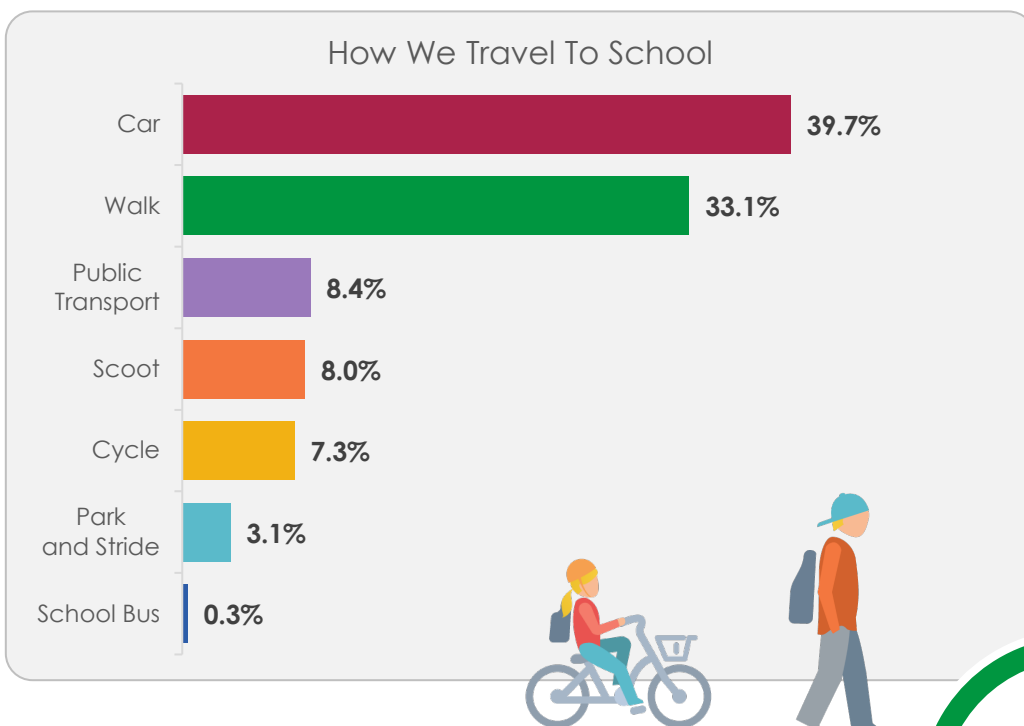
St. Anne's Primary School Travel Survey Results

Results of Our Travel Survey

Responses received: 114

Students represented: 206

Our school has been selected to participate in the Safe School Zones project. The objective of the project is to improve safety at the school gate and to support students to safely walk, cycle and scoot to school. The results of the Travel Survey and support for the Safe School Zones project is presented below.



91.2% of respondents agreed that road safety is a problem around the school

100.0% of respondents would support works at the front of school that improve student safety

100.0% of respondents would support works that improve the walking and cycling routes to our school

Some key comments received:

"There is no safe crossing for children and the amount of cars that park up - kids just run out in between cars so a good crossing and less cars would make this safer"

"I would like better traffic calming efforts around the school. Often it is too hard trying to get through the school with the amount of cars around. I feel it is not too safe for the kids."

Next Steps

SDCC will study the findings of the survey and develop a proposal for safety interventions at the school gate.
