# 1. Introduction

Envirico Ltd. have been engaged by South Dublin Co. Council, to undertake a survey of the Greenhills Park Dublin. This park provides open green space within the city and may be used by wintering birds associated with the South Dublin Bay and River Tolka Estuary SPA 004024 and the north Bull Island SPA 004006. These surveys were undertaken by Envirico Ltd. monthly from December 2024 to March 2025.

## 1.4 Scope of Survey:

On request of the client a wintering bird and badger survey was carried out at Greenhills Park, Limekiln Ln, Dublin. The purpose of this survey was to assess the distribution of wintering birds using the site and potential use by foraging badgers.

## 1.5 Survey Limitations:

Survey times during winter are limited by the combination of tide and daylight. The site is subject to regular disturbance through human activity, ranging from sports and maintenance to dog walking.

Detecting mammal activity on public playing surfaces and in areas of high dog activity may be hindered by these activities.

## 1.6 Statement of Authority:

**This report and aspects of field work have been completed by Envirico Ecologist Brian Power.**

Brian holds BSc (Hons) degree in Industrial Environmental Science from Institute of Technology Carlow and an MSc in Ecological Assessment from National University of Ireland Cork (UCC). Brian is an experienced ecological consultant with over 10 years' professional experience within consultancy. ## 2. Location details

The location of the Greenhills survey site is situated in the south Dublin City area, off Limekiln Lane and Ascaill na Tinileach. The survey area consists of Amenity Grassland (GA2) in the form of playing fields adjacent to Perrystown Community Centre, the pitch is surrounded and intersected by Artificial surfaces (BL3) in the form of walking tracks. The wider area consists primarily of urban settlement, associated amenity features and religious sites.

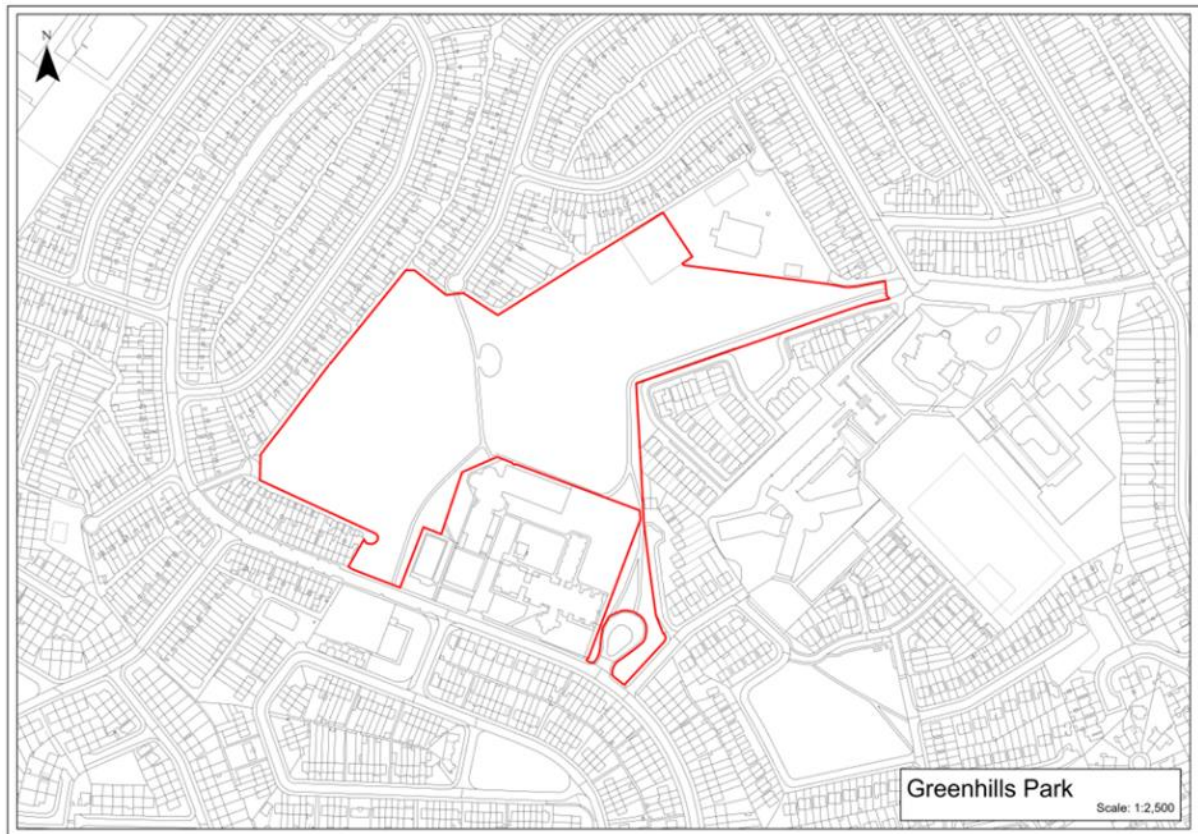


Figure 1: Site location

## 2.1 Project site in relation to Natura 2000 sites

The location of the Greenhills survey site is situated in the south Dublin City area, off Limekiln Lane and Ascaill na Tinileach. ## 2.2 Historic Records from the National Biodiversity Data Centre

### Bird Records

A total of 73 bird species records are available on the National Biodiversity Data Centre for grid squares O13A and O12E which encompass the site. These records are presented in Appendix II of this document.

### Mammal Records

There are no badger records available on the National Biodiversity Data Centre for grid square O13A, there are 5 badger records for O12E. A total of 9 species of mammal are recorded for these squares.

## 3. Methodology

### Wintering Bird Survey

The methodology for this survey is adapted from that of I-WeBS which uses the well-established technique of counting the numbers of waterbirds at wetland sites by the 'look-see' method (Bibby et al., 1992). Non-waterbird avifauna were also recorded. The area was accessed via Limekiln Ln. and covered by viewing from vantage points along the paths adjacent to the south of the site. Surveys were conducted over a three hour period, 90 minutes either side of high tide.

### Badger Survey

A field sign survey, including searches for latrines, badger paths and setts (NRA, 2008) was carried out in conjunction with each bird survey. Walkovers of the site and adjoining green areas were carried out to determine to the best of our ability the usage of the site by badgers.

<p>Dutch colour-ringed Black-headed gull present throughout the day. Frequent dog and human disturbance with birds usually relocating within the site and occasionally to adjacent rooftops. Conversation with a regular park visitor indicated the presence of geese using the site historically but had not encountered them in over 5 years, citing increase in dog activity and new housing estate as possible causes.</p> <p>Grey Squirrel recorded on site, numerous mammal tracks and evidence of rooting observed, strong smell of fox present. Mammal activity centred around bank adjoining Greenhills community college. Three cornered leek (<i>Allium triquetrum</i>) observed on site at multiple locations.</p> <p>Black-headed gulls present throughout the survey ranging from 32 to 71 on site with additional birds often present on adjoining rooftop of sports complex.</p> <p>Common gulls present throughout the survey ranging from 26 to 105 on site with additional birds often present on adjoining rooftop of sports complex.</p> <p>Both species were noted departing and returning to the site from the southwest with an arrival of birds also noted from the east.</p>

#### Visit Notes

No birds present on site at start of survey window due to the presence of several dogs. Birds arrived on site at 12:10.

Throughout the survey window there was a constant presence of dogs/ walkers on site.

Majority of dogs were off leads and actively chasing birds.

At 12:05 a ringed Black headed gull was observed on site. The ring colour was white however the bird was flushed from the site by a loose dog prior to the ring number being noted.

Oystercatcher was observed twice foraging in the western most field. Birds were present on both occasions for approximately 10 minutes before being flushed from the site by loose dogs and flying east.

Black-headed gulls present throughout the survey ranging from 6 to 72 on site with additional birds often present on adjoining rooftop of sports complex.

Common gulls present throughout the survey ranging from 5 to 15 on site with additional birds often present on adjoining rooftop of sports complex.

**Visit Notes**

Regular dog disturbance and activity throughout the survey, roosting assemblage continually disturbed. Birds present and feeding across the site with the western most fields holding the highest concentration of birds. Birds also being fed scraps. Dutch ringed Black-headed gull present throughout the survey period.

Occasional football played on eastern most pitch, birds moved to the periphery of play area before exiting to roof of adjacent building. Movement of both Black-headed gulls and Common Gulls to rooftop frequent throughout the survey, site used for preening and roosting during peak disturbance events. *Allium triquetrum* noted at additional location on boundary.

Black-headed gulls present throughout the survey ranging from 1 to 52 on site with additional birds often present on adjoining rooftop of sports complex

Common gulls present throughout the survey with the exception of a count at 14:40, with numbers ranging from 0 to 29 on site with additional birds often present on adjoining rooftop of sports complex.

## 5 Discussion

### 5.1 Overview of Wintering Birds

Over the course of the survey work a total of five species of gull were documented using the site, Black-headed, Common, Herring, Mediterranean and Lesser Black-back, along with Grey Heron and Oystercatcher. No Brent Geese were observed using, or from the site, anecdotal evidence from locals indicated that the pitches were used by geese until ~5 years ago. In addition to this a Great Black-back Gull was noted flying over the site

#### Black-headed Gull (*Chroicocephalus (Larus) ridibundus*)

Black-headed gulls are a SCI of the South Dublin Bay and River Tolka Estuary SPA 004024, the North Bull Island SPA 004006, and the North-west Irish Sea SPA 004236 which lie within 15kms of the survey location. Black-headed gulls were documented feeding and loafing on site across the majority of surveys with numbers tapering off in March. A peak count of 78 was recorded on the 20<sup>th</sup> February 2025. A colour ringed Black-headed gull was observed on site during December and January, white EVP5 and was ringed as an adult on the 07<sup>th</sup> June 2024 in Oegstgeest, Polder Poelgeest, the Netherlands. Another green colour ringed Black-headed Gull was observed at the survey location however the details could not be read.

Black-headed gulls were noted feeding across all green areas, predominantly on maintained playing surfaces, the western most pitch was regularly used as a loafing and preening area. When disturbed they were observed relocating within the site both to loaf and feed, birds were also observed using the community centre roof to the northeast of the site as a loafing and preening area. Numbers varied within each individual survey owing to regular disturbance issues, predominantly relating to loose dogs.

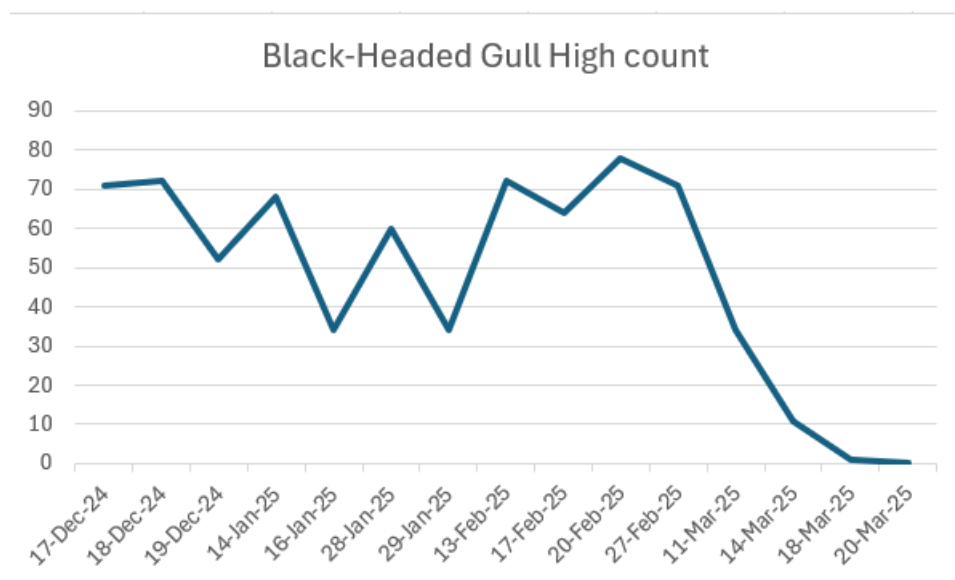


Figure 3: Black-headed gull peak counts per survey

### Common Gull (*Larus canus*)

Common gulls are a SCI of the North-west Irish Sea SPA 004236 which lies within 15kms of the survey location. Common gulls were documented feeding and loafing on site across the majority of surveys with numbers tapering off in March. A peak count of 105 was recorded on the 17<sup>th</sup> December 2024 and birds were present for the majority of the survey period with numbers dropping off in March and none recorded on the last two surveys.

Common gulls were noted feeding across all green areas, predominantly on maintained playing surfaces and the western most pitch was regularly used as a loafing and preening area associating in a mixed flock with Black-headed gulls and Herring Gulls.

When disturbed they were observed relocating within the site both to loaf and feed, birds were also observed using the community centre roof to the northeast of the site as a loafing and preening area. Numbers varied within each individual survey owing to regular disturbance issues, predominantly relating to loose dogs, with birds often vacating the area.

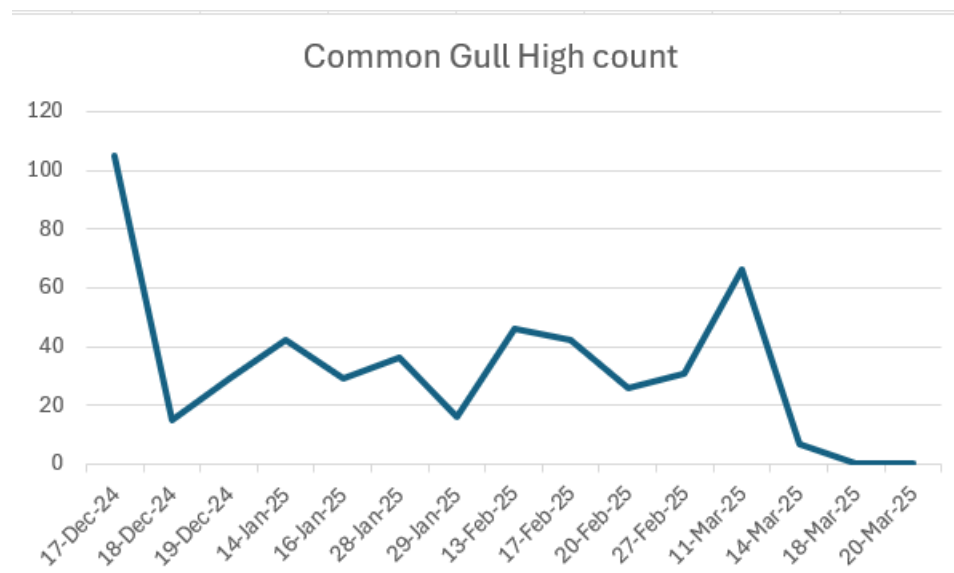


Figure 4: Common gull peak counts per survey

## Herring Gull (*Larus argentatus*)

Herring gulls are a SCI of the North-west Irish Sea SPA 004236 which lies within 15kms of the survey location. Herring gulls were observed on or adjacent to the site across the majority of surveys. A peak count of 34 was recorded on the 28<sup>th</sup> January 2025. They were observed frequently in and flying over adjacent estates using rooftops as perching points. Herring gulls were noted feeding across all green areas, both on maintained playing surfaces and other green areas. The western most pitch was regularly used as a loafing and preening area associating in a mixed gull flock.

When disturbed they were observed relocating occasionally within the site, but birds were also observed leaving and using the roofs to the north of the site as a loafing and preening area and returning when the area cleared. Numbers varied within each individual survey owing to regular disturbance issues, predominantly relating to loose dogs, with birds often vacating the area. Birds also entered the area to feed on bread and scraps discarded by people.

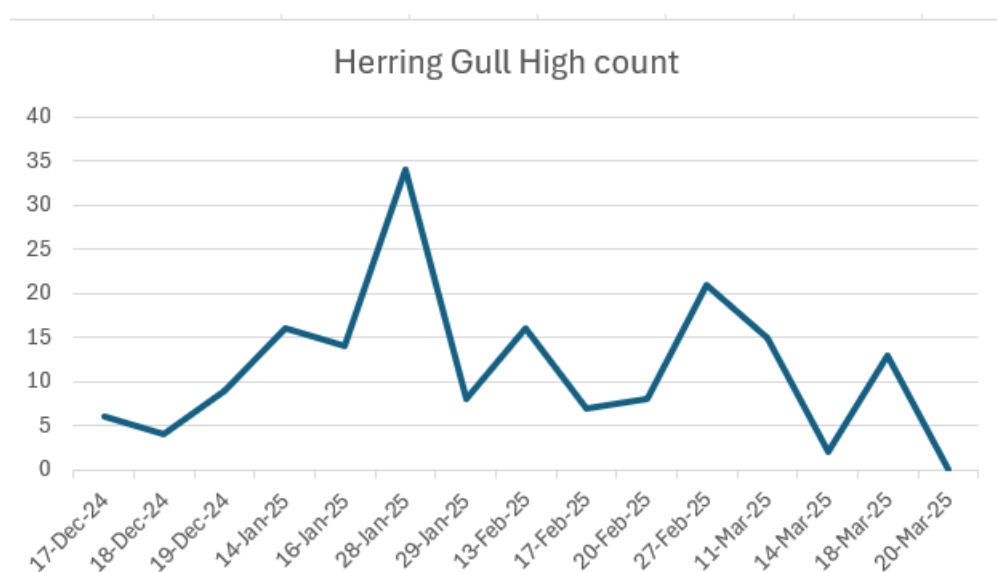


Figure 5: Herring Gull peak counts per survey

### Lesser Black-back Gull (*Larus fuscus*)

Lesser Black-back gulls were absent for the majority of the survey period. A single individual was present briefly loafing in a mixed gull flock on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2025, and a group of three individuals was documented on the 11<sup>th</sup> March 2025. Lesser Black-back gulls are a SCI of the North-west Irish Sea SPA 004236 which lies within 15kms of the survey location.

### Mediterranean Gull (*Larus melanocephalus*)

A single adult Mediterranean Gull was documented on site on 14<sup>th</sup> January 2025 feeding on the western pitches.

### Grey Heron (*Ardea cineraria*)

A single Grey Heron was documented on site on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2025, observed walking along a path in the southwest of the site with gulls.

### Oystercatcher (*Haematopus ostralegus*)

Oystercatchers are a SCI of the South Dublin Bay and River Tolka Estuary SPA 004024 and the North Bull Island SPA 004006. Oystercatchers were documented twice during the same survey on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2024 where two individuals fed briefly before being flushed, potentially the same two birds returned later in the survey.

### 5.3 Overview of Mammal activity

Mammal tracks were recorded across all surveys on site, these form well-worn routes along the southern boundary and branch into a small section of planted mini-woodland adjacent to the community college, the source of these tracks is unknown. No burrows or chambers were recorded on site.

Fox scat and a strong smell of Fox were recorded on multiple occasions. Grey Squirrel was noted on two occasions in December. The presence of Fox in the area was confirmed by ground staff and locals.

Evidence of rooting was found during multiple surveys and the same information logged by multiple surveyors; this has been detailed in the map below. The majority of rooting recorded was present in a section of meadow maintained for wildlife and in a small section of planted mini-woodland adjacent to the community college. Much of this rooting corresponds to that expected from badger, however, there may be some overlap with domesticated animals owing to the high levels of dog activity. Rooting

on the western boundary was in soft soil on the exterior of the site boundary in dumped soil, the cause of this rooting is unknown.

Two probable badger latrines were noted, one in the south and one in the west of the site.

Approximate locations of rooting, latrines, Fox scat and trails are presented in the map below, photographic evidence of these are presented in appendix I.
