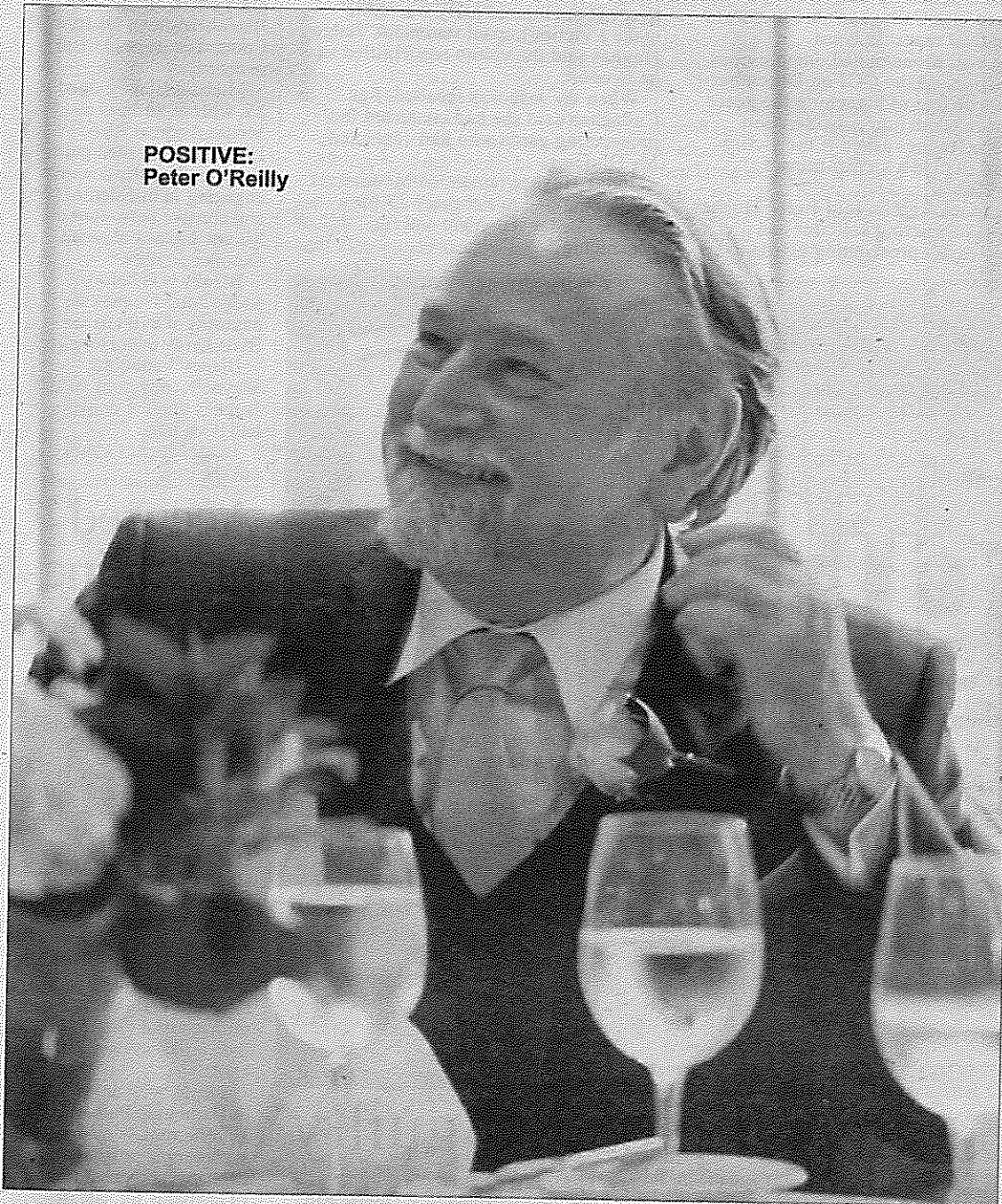


Remembering their dad with charity cycle

A KNOCKLYON family launched a charity cycle in honour of their much-loved father and husband in St James's Hospital on Tuesday.

The cycle, which will take place in May, is being held to raise funds for St James' Hospital Blood Cancer Research and to promote lymphoma symptom awareness.

Peter's family described him as being "our world", and his enduring passion for music prompted his family to name the event the Raglan Rollers Peter O'Reilly Charity cycle – fittingly, there will be live trad music in Ballyboden St Enda's Clubhouse following the cycle.

Peter's daughter, Kate O'Reilly, told *The Echo*: "My dad passed away from lymphoma two years ago this March, but if we had been more aware of the symptoms of lymphoma, we might have had a

September 2017, when he was suffering from fever and jaundice, and he was also misdiagnosed with a skin condition after getting treatment for a rash that was irritating him – with his family saying that they lost "valuable potential treatment time" as a result.

Looking ahead, the family now want to raise awareness of the signs and symptoms of lymphoma and to raise funds for St James' Hospital blood cancer research facility, all while keeping the memory of their



PROPOSED NEW WORKS TO PROTECTED STRUCTURE PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT ACT 2000 (AS AMENDED) PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS 2001 - 2018 PART 8 PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to the requirements of the above, notice is hereby given of the proposal to construct the following development by South Dublin County Council:

Proposed Saggart Community Centre, including conservation, renovation and extension of St. Mary's National School, Protected Structure, Slade Castle Walk, Boherboy, Saggart, Co. Dublin

The Community Centre development will consist of

- Conservation, restoration and renovation of existing St. Mary's National School building (unoccupied), Protected Structure, for use as Community Centre
- Demolition of rear north section of projection-extension of St. Mary's National School building to accommodate new entrance.
- Construction of new single storey entrance/ reception/ service area and new single storey multi-function hall for the proposed Community Centre with total floor area (including existing) of 610m²
- Five car parking spaces off Slade Castle Walk as per existing layout
- All associated works and services
- Provision of CCTV for security

The proposal has undergone Appropriate Assessment Screening under the Habitats Directive (92/43/EEC) and screening for Environmental Impact Assessment. The Planning Authority has made a preliminary examination of the nature, size and location of the proposed development. The authority has concluded that there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment arising from the proposed development and a determination has been made that an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is not required. Any person may, within 4-weeks from the date of publication of this notice, apply to An Bord Pleanála for a screening determination as to whether the development would be likely to have significant effects on the environment.

Drawings of the proposed development will be on public display at County Hall, Tallaght, Dublin 24 and Clondalkin Civic Offices, Dublin 22, during normal working hours and on <http://www.sdcc.ie/>, during the period from **21st February 2020 to 23rd March 2020**.
